
Aloha, everyone,

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR ADMINISTRATOR



hope you read a recent
Midweek featuring Executive
Director Randy Perreira who
spoke on the partnership of the
AFL-CIO and Aloha United Way's
Workplace Giving campaign
which has raised money through
unionized workplace fundraisers.

Perreira reported that one of their most successful annual campaigns is the annual Retiree Giving Program which raised over \$133,000 last year. I personally want to thank you for your generous support of the Giving Program as we begin another year of fundraising.

Today, it is much harder to get by let alone get ahead and the COVID pandemic has added a major hurdle to our daily lives. While the madness of anti-maskers and vaxxers who do not believe the medical breakthrough of taking the vaccines to save lives, yet continue to arrive daily at hospitals across the nation begging for medication. Proudly, retirees on the other hand have stepped up and taken the vaccinations at a much higher percentage than others. President Biden recently stated "we've been patient, but our patience is wearing thin, and your refusal has cost all of us." I encourage those that have not been vaccinated to please get the vaccination. Continue to wash your hands and always wear a mask when you are around anyone other than your immediate circle. Many clinics and pharmacies around the state offer free vaccinations. Equally important is the need to get your flu shot. Kaiser and HMSA have partnered with many businesses to make the shot available. Thank you retirees, who continue to do your part for the greater good of all of us.

Through the AFSCME Strong and PEOPLE programs, HGEA and other unions are trying to level the playing field by educating our members on the importance of continuing your union membership. Collectively, we will have a stronger voice at the negotiations table, at the legislature, and the worksite. For retirees, union strength is key to maintain and not lose any benefits. Article XVI, Section 2 of the Hawaii State Constitution says that once the State and Counties agreed to provide to retirees certain rights and benefits, those rights and benefits cannot be diminished or impaired thereafter in any way. We know that without the union as your watchdog, and support from the union endorsed candidates, laws like this one are always challenged in one way or another. President Ethel Fleming and the State Board has made increasing membership a priority. Please reach out to co-workers, friends and neighbors to join our retiree unit.

Along with your HGEA staff, the retiree chapter boards and retiree state board of directors are all PEOPLE members. What is PEOPLE you ask? First, it stands for Public Employees Organized to Promote Legislative Equality. As an affiliate of AFSCME, HGEA receives essential monetary funds to help support campaigns of union endorsed candidates. PEOPLE is AFSCME's political, legislative and most importantly, fundraising arm. Contributing to PEOPLE is the difference between having things happen to you and making things happen. The Retirees Unit is committed to have 10% of our membership be PEOPLE members and so I am again asking each and every one of you reading this message to join the PEOPLE program. At \$8.40 a month, it translates to less than 30 cents a day for protection of Family and Medical leave, cost of living adjustments for retiree pensions, efforts that want to eliminate the Medicare Part B reimbursement, strengthen Social Security and oppose efforts to cut Medicare and Medicaid. In the past few sessions, efforts to eliminate life insurance plans for both active and retired employees, forgoing dental and vision coverage, and taxing pensions, are battles that the HGEA Retirees Unit have fought and won. PEOPLE dollars have funded direct mail and paid media for battles across the state and the country. All retiree and active board members are MVP PEOPLE members and 100% of the HGEA staff are MVP PEOPLE members. I urge you to become a PEOPLE member and be part of this growing movement. I encourage you to enlist your family and friends to join us as we continue this fight and prepare for battles vet to come.
