

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR ADMINISTRATOR



the Chinese Zodiac, 2022 is the Year of the Tiger. Tiger people were born in the 12-year cycle from 1938, 1950, 1962, 1974, 1986,1998, 2010 and 2022. A few characteristics are courageous, energetic, love a challenge or competition and are prepared to take risks. I hope we have a lot of Tiger people as we head toward our mid-term elections where your energy will be greatly appreciated.

Before going further, I would like to echo President Lee Saunders message of standing in support with the people of Ukraine in opposition to Russian Aggression. The International Executive Board passed a resolution expressing our solidarity with the people of Ukraine, including a strong condemnation of Putin's aggression and our support for economic sanctions designed to cripple the Russian economy. AFSCME's belief in human rights - wherever in the world they may be threatened- demands that we do what we can. We hope that you will consider a contribution to international relief organizations that are moving humanitarian aid to the people of Ukraine.

It was exactly two years ago that HGEA closed to in-person meetings. The Retirees Unit held their State Board of Directors meeting in March 2020 and the next day we went into quarantine mode due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Seniors were the first authorized to get vaccinations and you sure did, understanding the importance to your families and communities. As we now look to conduct in-person meetings and activities, we will only be successful if we continue to "follow the science". For now, mask wearing is optional at all HGEA functions. I do look forward to meeting in person again, sharing a lunch or learning a new skill or idea from our activities. Please call the HGEA offices to RSVP and to check if there are any changes just in case we cancel or postpone an activity due to restrictions.

The 31st legislature began on January 19th with minimal celebration as the Capitol was not opened to the public. The good news is that the Capitol reopened on March 7 but may be adjusted due to evolving Covid19 changes. For HGEA Retirees, there are no take away's to report that would diminish any of your benefits to current members in the ERS. However, there are two bills that would eliminate the Medicare Part B reimbursement for new hires and their spouses effective July 1.

There are several bills from the Kupuna Caucus and other senior groups that support Long-term care, assisting caregivers, criminal offenses against seniors and Senator Brian Taniguchi's bill relating to Hawaii Retirement Savings plan for private sector employees that do not have an employer sponsored retirement plan. As you know from our March press conferences, the State Board of Directors approved the endorsement of Josh Green for Governor and Sylvia Luke for Lt. Governor. This action followed the unanimous recommendation from the State Political Action committee made up of members from each unit including the Retirees and Excluded Units. Please watch for our complete list of endorsements as the Island PAC's and State PAC continue their candidate interviews. All the interviews are open to any member, and questions can be submitted to the PAC Committee's on each island.

President Fleming's priority continues to be membership recruitment. I humbly ask each of you to reach

out to your former coworkers, family and friends to ask them to join our unit. As I have often stated, we are stronger in numbers. The work didn't end when you retired, so we must continue to be our own advocates to protect our pension and medical benefits. As ERS members, you fought for your hard -earned benefits in your bargaining unit contracts. As retirees that strength comes in numbers, the larger our group is, the stronger our voices are. That makes a world of difference as legislators look to balance budgets. WE have found that when you ask someone one on one to join you as a retiree member of HGEA most people will say yes. Bring a friend with you to our next activity or meeting, share your newsletter with them, call me or any of your chapter board members to meet them. Also I ask you to please join our PEOPLE program for just \$8.40 a month. This AFSCME program is what attempts to level the playing field against the billionaire dollars spent on getting candidates elected. It is another way retirees can participate in the campaign process especially when many cannot get out to canvass or physically help in a campaign. Again call me or any chapter board member to become a PEOPLE member. As Board Director and MVP PEOPLE member Aileen Obina stated many years ago, "she participates in PEOPLE to protect her hard earned benefits and personally asks that you join her in support of this program to protect benefits for all of us". All, 100% of the State Board and Chapter board members and HGEA staff are MVP PEOPLE members. Please join us today! You can send a check payable to PEOPLE for \$100 for a year membership or \$8.40 a month. Include your jacket size and AFSCME will send a green PEOPLE jacket. Thank you in advance of both the Retiree Unit and PEOPLE membership program.

If you are interested in conducting a class from crafting or cooking or sewing, cleaning, pruning, canning drawing or planting, in other words just about anything you are willing to teach, please reach out to me or any chapter board member.
