

School's out, summer is here, and HGEA is gearing up for Political Action! Let me hear it, CHEEHOO for phone banking, shaka waving, candidate forums, and the buzz of who is running for what seat. Seriously, the 2022 elections should be top of mind for all of us, from local council seats, state legislative seats, two mayors, and a governor race to our Congressional

elections. As you recall, we early endorsed Senator Brian Schatz, Speaker Scott Saiki, and recently endorsed Josh Green for Governor and Sylvia Luke for Lt. Governor. So get out your HGEA green shirts and volunteer.

If you do not have a shirt, be sure to ask for one at your first volunteer event. This Ho'olaha includes all the races that we have endorsed a candidate and even those that are open or not endorsed. You are welcome to get informed about who is in the race and make your selection.

With so much at stake, Roe v. Wade, gun reform, the Supreme Court and Judge nominations, plus our local concerns like Mauna Kea, Hawaiian Homelands, Education, Housing and water issues, the political arena is troubling. Republicans continue to refuse to look at legislation that the public supports and instead focus on more guns, voter suppression, and the last Presidential election. Gone are the days of bipartisan politics where a handshake meant something.

Many of today's politicians care only about the next election. So, Retirees, get active, participate, and make sure the counties have your current address because Hawaii is a Vote by Mail state. You should have received the yellow voter registration card in the mail that shows you are registered. If you did not receive the yellow card, call the Elections office on your island.
