## A MESSAGE FROM YOUR ADMINISTRATOR



Over the past few months, regular activities paused as we concentrated on supporting our HGEA endorsed candidates. MAHALO to the Hawaii and Oahu chapter members who volunteered many hours to call fellow retirees during our July and August phone banks. Member feedback was positive and appreciative of fellow members calling in support of the

candidates. Most of the endorsed candidates won their races, including the top races for Governor, Lt. Governor, Congressional District 1 & 2, and Speaker Saiki's race. All members' votes and support from the HGEA PAC made the election a success for HGEA. However, the work is not over as we approach the General Election. In this issue, you will find a list of HGEA endorsed candidates for the General Election.

The 2022 AFSCME convention held in July began with a bittersweet tribute to the life of President Gerald McEntee, who passed away on July 10, just a day before the start of the convention. President Biden noted that Jerry McEntee was the "labor leader who transformed AFSCME into a beacon of hope for American workers and families." Many were saddened at the news of President McEntee's passing but vowed to continue the work of organizing and building the union.

The convention schedule included speeches from AFSCME President Lee Saunders, Secretary-Treasurer Elissa McBride, Labor Secretary Marty Walsh, and political leader Stacey Abrams. In addition, we participated in a solidarity rally with our brothers and sisters negotiating their first contract with the Metropolitan Museum of Arts and conducted business to debate and vote on changes to the AFSCME Bylaws.

CONGRATULATIONS RETIREES! HGEA retirees received 4th place at the convention for our PEOPLE participation. It was an honor to be recognized, and I enjoyed seeing our HGEA Logo on the big screen. (Continued on next page ...)

PEOPLE stands for Public Employees Organized to Promote Legislative Equality and is the arm used to assist with candidate campaigns and educate members on issues. The PEOPLE program is what we use to promote candidates and issues that are important to members. If you are not a PEOPLE member, please consider joining for \$8.40 a month. You can call our HGEA office to help with enrollment into the program. If you enroll as an MVP member, you will receive a PEOPLE jacket.

HGEA bargaining unit members met at the Hilton Waikoloa to participate in the 26th Biennial General Assembly in early September. The two-day convention began with inspiring speeches from Executive Director Randy Perreira and AFSCME President Lee Saunders. The delegates approved four general resolutions, and there were no bylaw changes. The convention ended with a banquet dinner and dancing. Don't forget, the Retiree convention will be held next June 2023 on the Big Island.

Throughout September, Kaiser and HMSA attended each chapter's general membership meeting to answer questions and clarify benefits. As a reminder, you may change your plan during open enrollment, which will take place from October 17-31, 2022. Also, Kaiser will hold an informational webinar; you can find the webinar registration information in this issue. In addition, HMSA wants to partner with HGEA retirees; please email or call me if you have suggestions.

I look forward to meeting with active working members in October and November as we restart our Planning for Retirement seminars. The Retirees unit is actively seeking to expand our membership. These seminars inform members of the retiree unit and provide information from the ERS and EUTF. The sessions for Maui and Kauai are on October 8 & 15, Oahu on November 5, and Hilo on November 19. Also, we recently partnered with AFSCME on a statewide recruitment mailout to 11,473 potential members, and I am hopeful of its success. Please continue to encourage co-workers and friends to join our unit. We are stronger in numbers. The Alzheimer's Association will present information to each island at the upcoming sessions in January as follows: Oahu on January 5, Maui on January 12, Hilo on January 19, and Kauai on January 26. Please RSVP with the division office.

Our keiki are back in school, and the holidays are around the corner! So, I encourage you to stay safe, socially distance yourself, and get your flu shots and the latest COVID booster. General Election is on November 8, and you should receive your ballot mid-October. Please remember to complete your mail-in ballot as soon as you receive it and encourage your family and friends to support HGEA's endorsed candidates.
