A MESSAGE FROM YOUR ADMINISTRATOR



Hauoli Makahiki Hou! Happy 2023 and greetings to everyone near and far!

With much anticipation of exciting adventures for this new year, your Board of Directors planned to start the year off strong with presentations from the Alzheimer's Association in January, gathering in Waimea for the Cherry Blossom Festival in February, and rounding out the first quarter with Chapter Board Elections in March.

Every chapter seat from directors to officers along with the state director seats will be open for any member in good standing to run for office. If you are interested in running, you must call the HGEA Retiree Office to obtain a nomination form and submit your completed form by February 28, 2023.

Why should you run? Serving as a representative of your island board chapter means planning events and activities, and supporting the union in political matters. While meetings are only held quarterly, elected officers are also expected to dedicate time to attend monthly events. President Ethel Fleming and Convention Co-Chairs, Evelyn Togashi and Ruth Walker, have begun planning the 25th Biennial Assembly Convention which will take place at the Hilo Hawaiian Hotel on June 6-7, 2023. Convention business will include the Election of the Officers for the State Board of Directors, any bylaw amendments submitted by the February 6, 2023 deadline, and installation of the Chapter Board of Directors. This year's Convention theme is "All Together" to celebrate gathering together after the years spent apart during the Covid-19 pandemic. It is also mirrors the theme used at the July AFSCME convention in Philadelphia. As a reminder, Chapter Presidents need help with activity ideas and planning. Please contact your respective island division office or Chapter President directly if you have suggestions or want to get involved. Additionally, if you are interested in sharing your hobby or hosting a "talk story" session with fellow retiree members, please contact me to schedule your session.

The Retirees Unit is always recruiting new members, so please let your former coworkers, family, and friends know about the benefits of membership. I am available to do a short presentation if you would like to request one for a group of potential members. Member dues are \$6 and will not only provide opportunities to participate in retiree activities, but access to the HGEA Makana Perks and Discounts program with 100+ discount partners.

On the political side, we celebrated the 94th birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. on January 16, 2023. An important quote from Dr. King which is relevant to this day is: "So long as I do not firmly and irrevocably possess the right to vote I do not possess myself." As Dr. King stated, "a right delayed is a right denied."

As we watched the GOP congressional members make a disaster of their Speaker election, it was a pleasure to see Congresswomen Jill Tokuda sworn in. Always a voice of reason, she is ready to tackle the work in what she refers to as "the People's house." We should all be proud of how she represents her Hawaii constituents.

In Hawaii, the 2023 Legislative Session convened on January 18, 2023. I do not expect bills with major impacts to retirees, but will remain vigilant while reviewing them. Nationally, with your support of the PEOPLE campaign, AFSCME continues to push for the passage of voting rights along with President Biden's initiatives, which includes the Build Back Better, Rescue, and Infrastructure Acts that passed with bipartisan support. We expect these initiatives to lay a positive foundation for a successful 2024 campaign.

We encourage you to stay informed on issues such as the Social Security and Medicare/Medicaid legislation. Senators Brian Schatz and Mazie Hirono along with other lawmakers are looking to expand Social Security. Senator John Larson's bill added two more senators as sponsors, but Republican support is critical for passage.

The 2023 standard Medicare Part B premium is down \$5.20 from the \$170.10 in 2022 to \$164.90 in 2023. As a reminder, if you are paying higher than the standard premium, you must submit a copy of your letter from the Social Security Administration to the EUTF in order to be reimbursed for the higher premium amount. Send your letter to EUTF, 201 Merchant Street, Suite 1700, Honolulu, HI 96813.




25th BIENNIAL ASSEMBLY CONVENTION ANNOUNCEMENT

Bylaw amendments must be submitted in writing to the Retirees Unit Administrator by February 6, 2023. General resolutions must be submitted in writing to the Retirees Unit Administrator by March 6, 2023. Please refer to your respective Chapter Presidents for chapter convention delegate selections.

*As stated in Article VIII Biennial Assembly, Section 1. Notice of Date of Biennial Assembly of the Retiree Unit Bylaws: "Notice of the date of the Biennial Assembly shall be given not less than forty-five (45) days prior thereto..." Section 2. (a) Bylaw Amendments states, "Amendments to the bylaws of the Retirees Unit shall not be considered unless submitted in writing and filed with the Retirees Unit Administrator at least one hundred twenty (120) days before the opening..." Section 5. (c) Delegate Selection states, "delegates may be required to meet qualification requirements as established by each chapter..."
